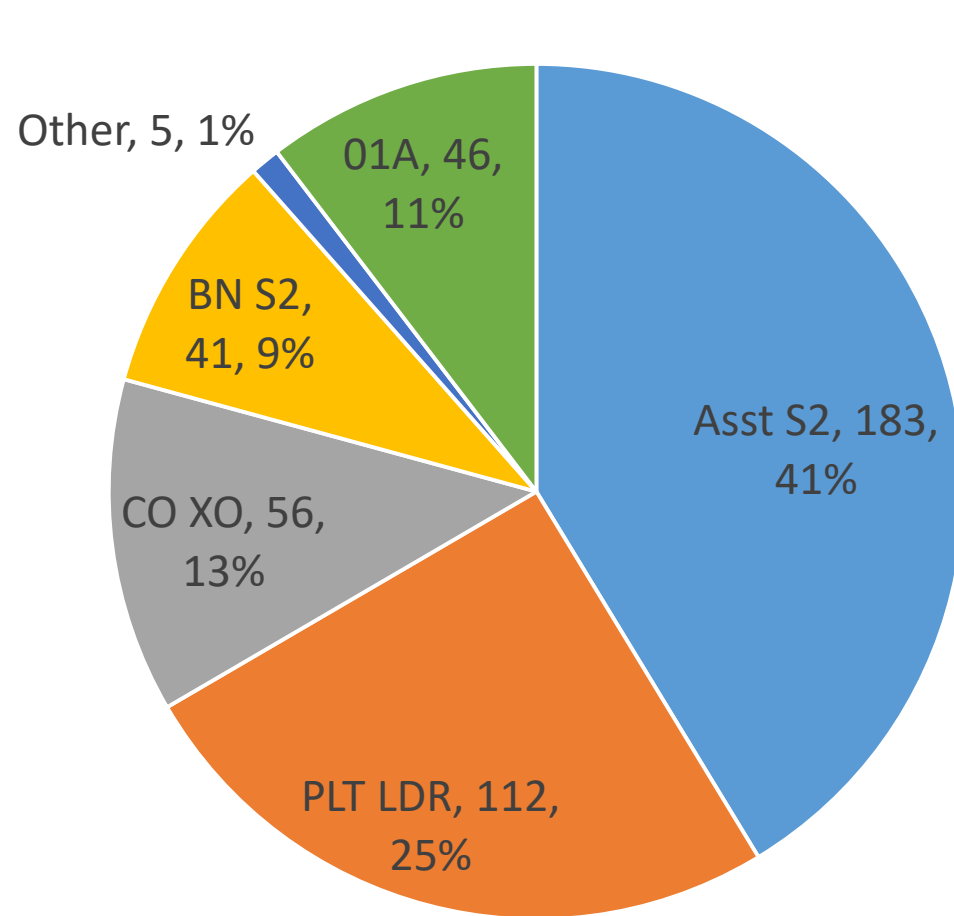

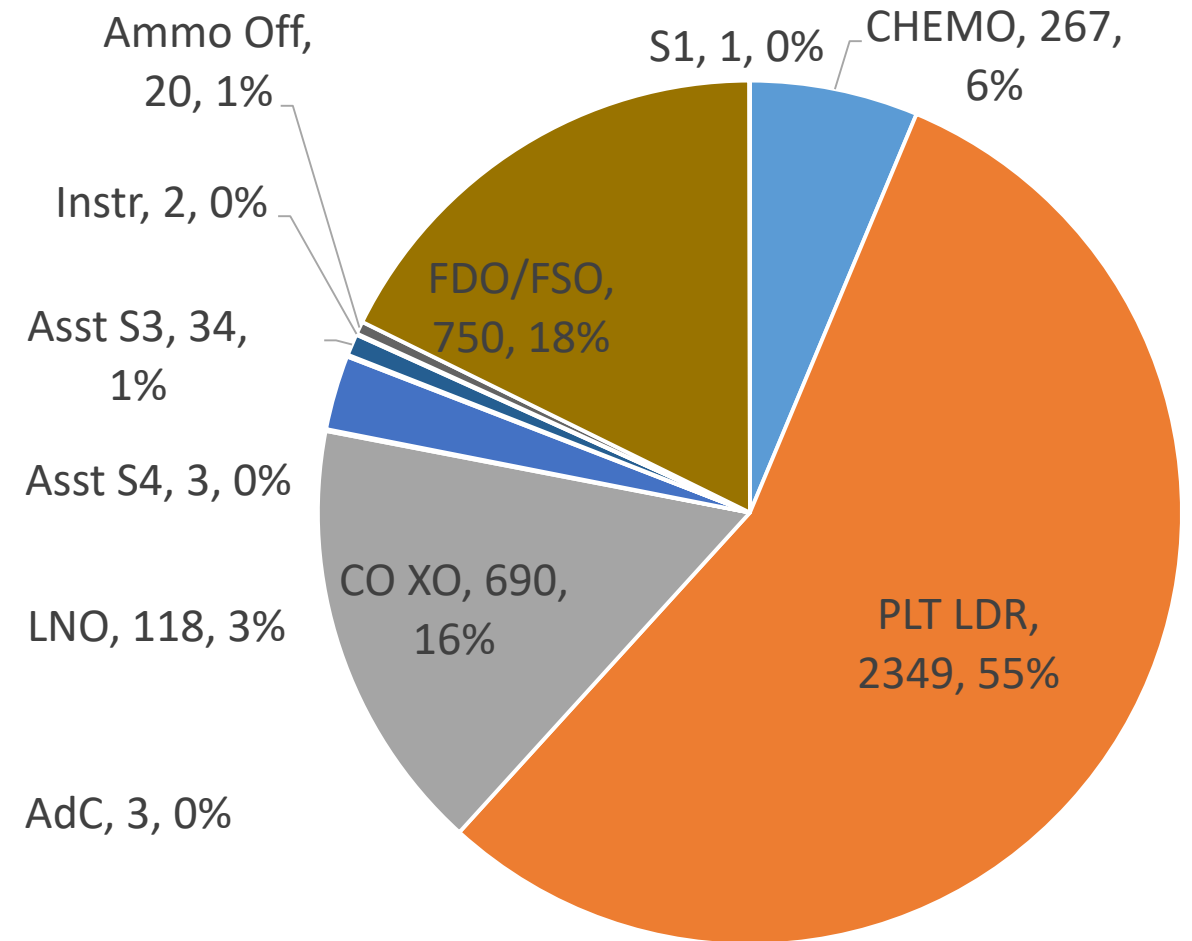
Why Intelligence – Why You?

- It's a key instrument of national power
- Inherently joint, interagency, intergovernmental, and multinational
- As the singular corps fulfilling an Army warfighting function, MI supports:
 - Force generation
 - Situational understanding
 - Targeting & information capabilities
 - Information collection
- Talents: logical/analytical, keen communications, perceptive, mentally tough, excellent problem solving, inspirational leadership
- Behaviors: collaborative, thinks critically, detail focused, diligent, disciplined, physically and mentally fit, initiative, resilient
- Knowledge: diversely & relevantly educated, trained, & experienced

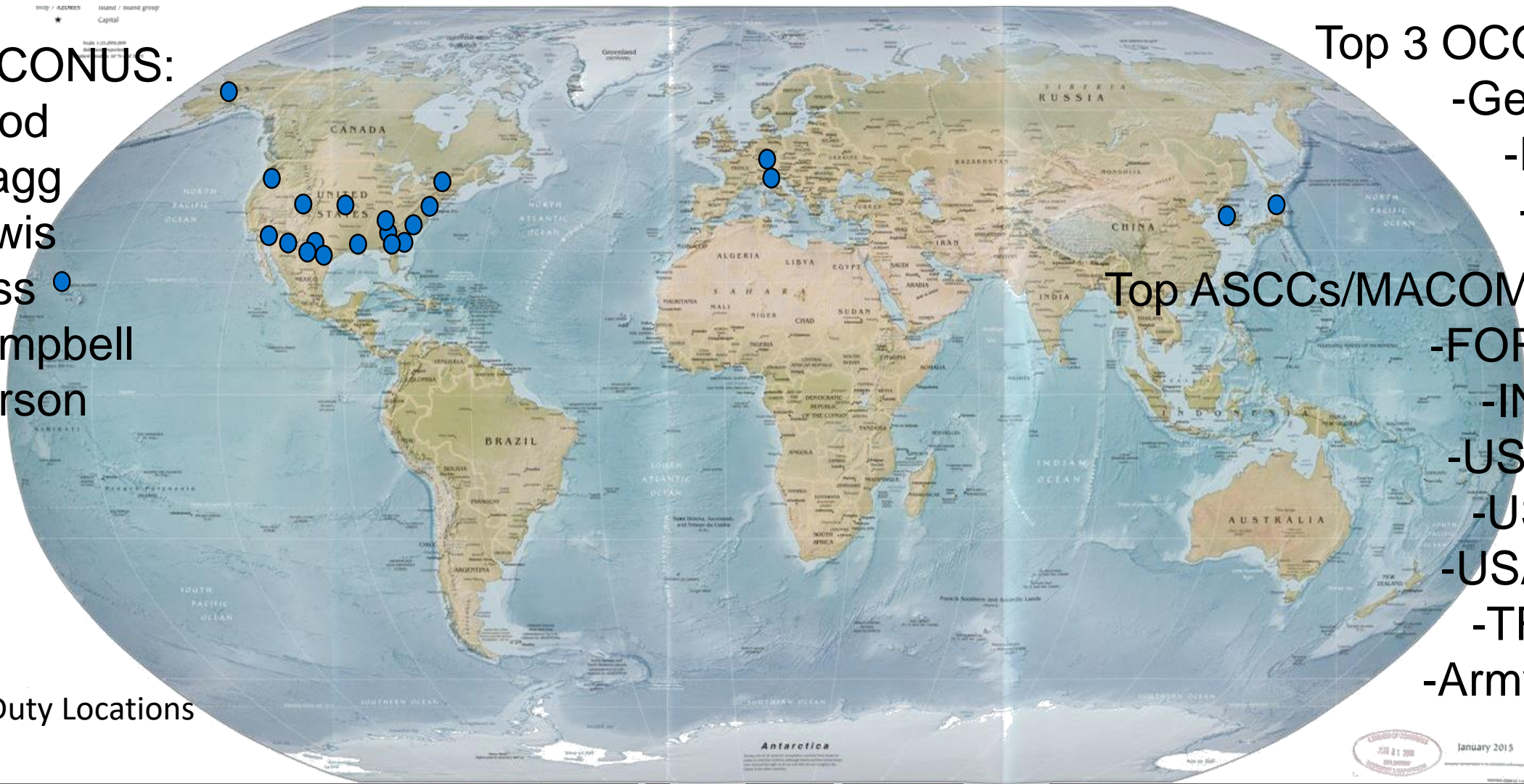

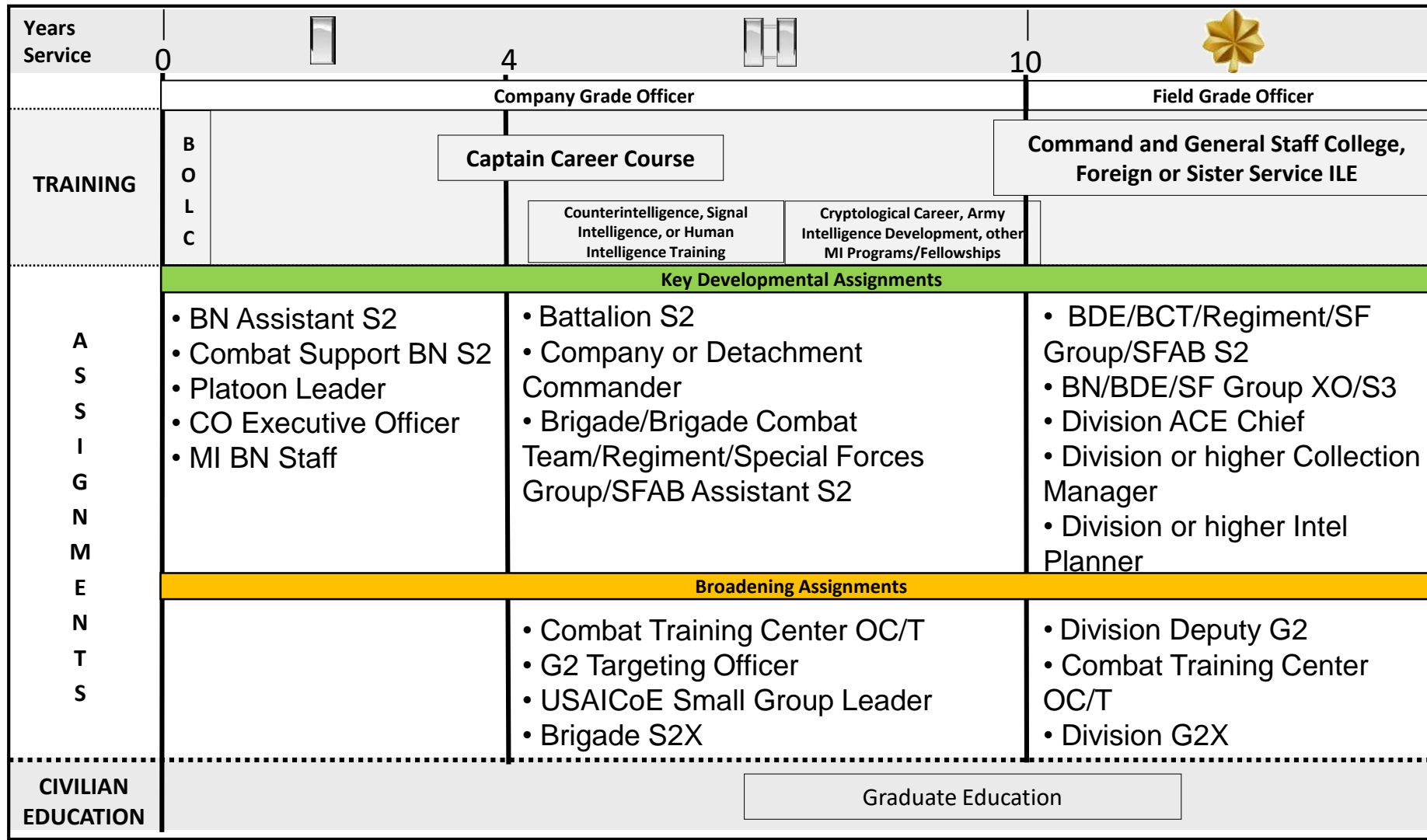

MI LIEUTENANT DEVELOPMENT PATH

- Successful completion of the Military Intelligence Basic Officer Leader Course (BOLC) at the U.S. Army Intelligence Center of Excellence at Fort Huachuca, AZ.
- After completing the Military Intelligence BOLC, Military Intelligence lieutenants will serve with Soldiers in leadership developmental positions such as platoon leader, XO, or in other assignments such as assistant S2, combat support battalion S2, assistant brigade S2 or staff officer in a Military Intelligence battalion. Military Intelligence lieutenants most commonly serve as intelligence officers at echelons corps and below.
- Self-development. Lieutenants should take every opportunity to broaden their knowledge of all aspects of military intelligence through studying doctrine, professional readings, and personal research into intelligence related topics.

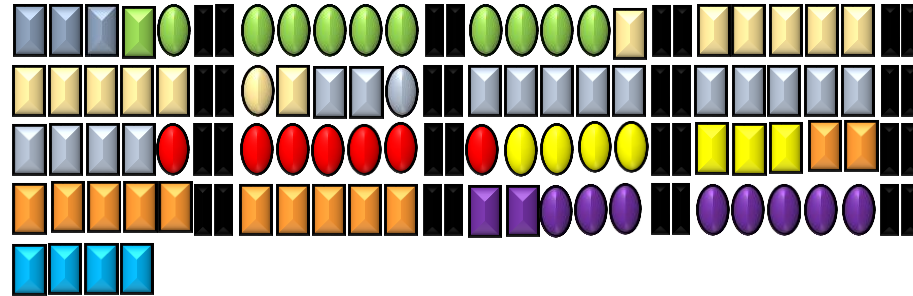

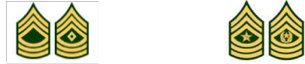

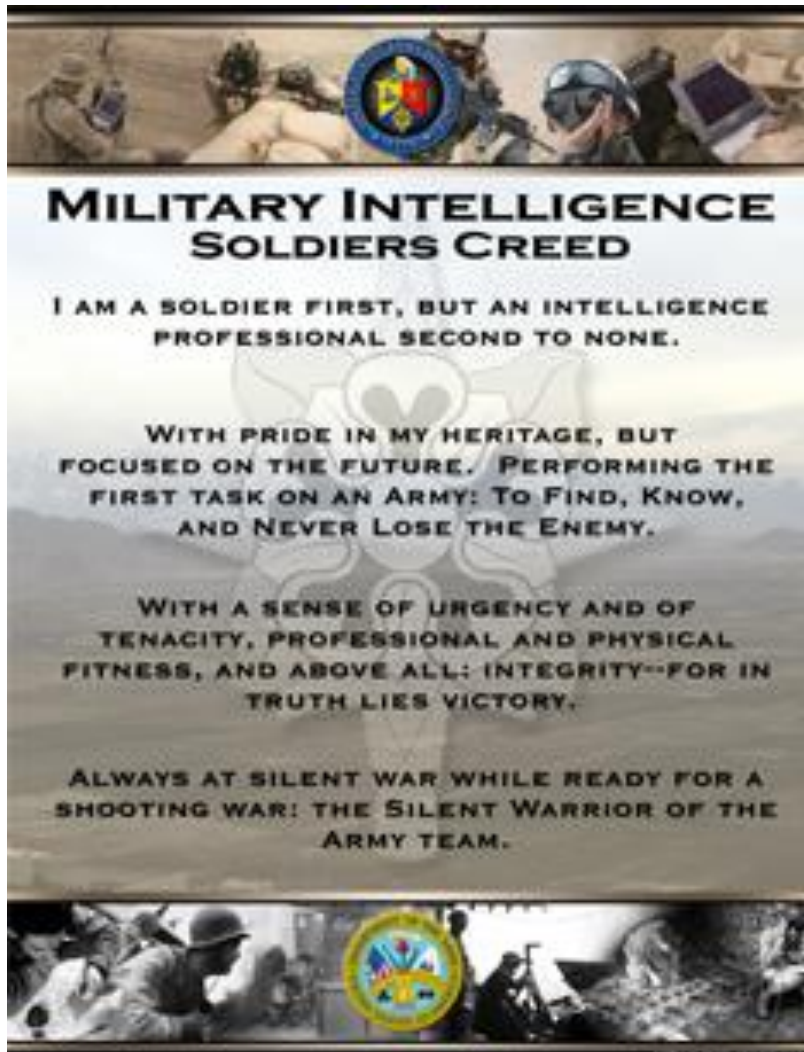

What Are Common Questions?

- **Language Training for Officers?**
 - Formal language training at DLI is reserved for enlisted specialties that require language proficiency and for Foreign Area Officer training.
- **Is Branch Detail a good way to go? Will I be disadvantaged at the Career Course?**
 - About half of all MI officers begin their career in a detailed assignment. There is no statistical difference for success at grade or in future CSL.
- **When do I get to work with...CIA, FBI, NSA?**
 - Direct work with the Intelligence Community is based on unit and operational requirements. Assignments to those agencies typically begin at Major and higher.
- **When will I receive additional training?**
 - Training for Additional Skills is negotiated with the assignment officer during MICCC attendance. Training takes place following MICCC graduation and before reporting to follow-on duty assignment.
- **What should I study to help me as an MI officer?**
 - We invite diversity in degree area. Ensure you select an area of study based on your interests and strengths.
- **When can I transfer to Civil Affairs/PSYOP/Cyber or a Functional Area?**
 - Branch transfer opportunities are present beginning upon selection for promotion to Captain (1LT/P). Transfer opportunities to functional areas become available following success in KD assignments as a Captain. Interested Officers should look for announcements from HRC and their assignment officers for opportunities.
- **Can I stay in my detail branch?**
 - This is possible if the detail branch and control branch both agree to the action.
- **Where will I be stationed?**
 - MI Officers are assigned to worldwide duty locations, either within maneuver forces as S2 Officers or in larger MI units as leaders.
